Minutes of the Twentieth Convention of The Missouri District of The Lutheran Church— Missouri Synod, June 10-12, 2018, Columbia, Missouri

Theme: Faithful Witnesses

The convention commenced on Sunday, June 10 with a Divine Service hosted by St. Paul's Lutheran Church, Des Peres, Missouri. The preacher for the opening service was the Rev. Dr. Daniel Preus, Fifth Vice-President of The Lutheran Church—Missouri Synod. His sermon was based on Isaiah 44:8 with the sermon entitled, "Fear Not." The offering, which will be split between career missionaries from the Missouri District and the Missouri District's Plus One Initiative, totaled \$16,941.

Minutes of Session One – Monday, June 11, 8:00 am.

The opening devotion was led by the Rev. Dr. David Smith, St. Paul's Lutheran Church, Des Peres. His devotion highlighted the theme of the convention, "Faithful Witnesses."

President Lee Hagan called the convention to order at 8:20 am in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit.

Rev. Samuel Powell, secretary of the convention, provided the first registration report as follows:

President Hagan presented the Standing Rules to the assembly. It was moved and seconded to adopt the Standing Rules. A voice vote was taken and the motion passed unanimously.

President Hagan directed the delegates to the Agenda as printed in the convention workbook, pages 10-11 for review. It was moved and seconded to adopt the Agenda. With no objections, the Agenda was adopted as presented.

First Vice-President William Marler took the chair for the President's Report. The President's Report cited three main areas of focus from the last three years: church worker health, changing congregational culture so that we respond to conflict based on the Word of God, and maintaining a mission focus. A fuller summary of the President's Report can be found in Volume 20, Issue 3 of the Convention's Today's Business.

President Hagan returned to the chair. President Hagan called for the Rev. David Mueller, chair of the Elections Committee, to come forward to give an orientation to the voting system.

President Hagan called for Mr. Dale Werts, chairman of the three tellers from the Board of Directors, to present the nominating slate for the office of president. The slate for president is as follows:

Nominations were solicited from the floor and none were received. The slate was presented to the delegates for ratification. The results were as follows:

Rev. Dr. David Smith offered a prayer in preparation of the balloting for District President.

Rev. Powell gave another registration report as follows:

The first ballot for president provided the following results:

Rev. Dr. R. Lee Hagan was re-elected as District President.

Chief teller, Mr. Dale Werts, presented the slate for First Vice-President with the number of nominations as follows:

Nominations were solicited from the floor and none were received. The slate was presented to the delegates for ratification. The results were as follows:

Rev. David Mueller of the Elections Committee presented the information for the nominations of the Second through Fourth Vice-Presidents.

The floor committee moved adoption.

The floor committee moved adoption.

For 339 (97.1%) 10 (2.9%) Against

319 (91.9%) 28 (8.1%) Against

Floor Committee Four finished its work before the convention. Rev. Dr. Golden introduced the members of the committee and the Structure Task Force and the convention thanked them for their work with a round of applause.

Rev. David Smith shared an update with the convention on a prayer request and led the assembly in prayer.

District Fourth Vice-President, Rev. Brian Thieme took the chair for President Hagan's acceptance speech. The text of President Hagan's acceptance speech is included in the Volume 20, Issue 3 of the convention's Today's Business.

After his acceptance speech, President Hagan assumed the chair again and invited Rev. Kristopher Morris to the stage to present the work of Floor Committee Three to the convention.

Resolution 3-04 was adopted.

Floor Committee Three finished its work before the convention, Rev. Morris introduced the members of his committee and the convention thanked them for their work with a round of applause.

Another Plus One Initiative video was shared with convention.

Mrs. Christie Steffens was introduced to the convention to bring greetings from the Missouri District LWML, which just finished their own convention. Mrs. Steffens is the outgoing president. Mrs. Sally Hendrick, newly elected president, was unable to attend.

Rev. Smith came forward to give a prayer on behalf of Mrs. Steffens' husband who just had been taken to the hospital.

Mr. David Fiedler, CEO of the LCMS Foundation, was introduced to the convention to bring greetings on behalf of the Foundation. The organization is celebrating 60 years of service to the LCMS.

Mr. Casey Carlson, LCEF Vice-President, was introduced to the convention to bring greetings on behalf of LCEF. He closed with a word of prayer for the district.

Another Plus One Initiative video was shared with the convention.

Rev. Smith came forward for a meal prayer and a hymn.

The convention went into recess for lunch at 11:35 a.m.

Minutes of Session Two – Monday, June 11, 1:00 pm

The convention came back into order after lunch. The essayist, Dr. Adam Francisco, was introduced to the assembly. Part one of his essay focused on views proposed by scholars on what has caused a shift in the view of God in Western culture over the last 500 years. A more complete summary of part one is provided in Volume 20, Issue 3 of Today's Business.

President Hagan called the orders of the day. The Nominations Committee was called forward.

Dr. Mart Thompson brought greetings on behalf of Concordia Seminary, St. Louis and President Dale Meyer.

District Third Vice President, Rev. Al Wollenburg assumed the chair for LCMS President Matthew Harrison's report to the convention.

Rev. Dr. Matthew C. Harrison's report included a video produced by The Lutheran Church-Missouri Synod. He also shared information related to the work of the synod and the stability of the synod. Much of the information shared centered on the theme, "Joy:fully Lutheran." President Harrison took questions from the floor at the end of his report.

Floor Committee 1 – Witness and Mercy

Resolution 1-01 (Workbook page 64)

To Encourage Participation in Missouri District Plus One Initiative

Whereas congregations of all sizes and in all communities have outreach initiatives and many have participated in Plus One; and

Whereas the 2017 Mission Summit provided ideas and support for congregations in their community outreach efforts; and

Whereas thousands of people have heard the Gospel through Plus One events; and

Whereas there are still congregations that are showing interest in Plus One; therefore, be it

Resolved that the Missouri District in convention give thanks to God for the congregations that have participated in Plus One; and, be it further

Resolved that the leadership of each Missouri District congregation be encouraged to review the Plus One initiative with its congregation; and, be it further

Resolved that all congregations of the district prayerfully consider participation in Plus One; and, be it further

Resolved that Plus One be expanded to encourage schools and educational ministries to participate; and, be it finally

Resolved that the Missouri District leaders and staff continue to provide support, encouragement and training for congregation members to be faithful witnesses as we engage our communities with Christ's Word and love.

Resolved, that we give thanks to God that congregations and individuals have eagerly provided effective emergency assistance and response to disasters especially through the work of Lutheran Early Response Teams; and be it further,

Resolved, that the work of LERT be recognized and commended in our congregations; and, be it further

Resolved, that circuits and congregations be encouraged to sponsor and schedule LERT training events during the next triennium, and be it finally

Resolved, that members of Missouri District congregations be encouraged to receive LERT training so that they are prepared and available to respond more effectively to disasters.

Resolved that the Missouri District in convention commend "Every One His Witness" for congregational use.

To Encourage and Give Thanks for Expanded Outreach to Immigrant and Ethnic Communities

Whereas, Holy Scriptures tells us that "God desires all people be saved and come to the knowledge of the truth" (1 Timothy 2:4); and pictures heaven as, "a great multitude that no one could number, from every nation, from all tribes and peoples and languages, standing before the throne and before the Lamb, clothed in white robes, with palm branches in their hands" (Revelation 7:9); and

Resolved, that congregations be encouraged to use available demographic resources to identify ethnic and immigrant neighbors in their communities, and be it further

Resolved, that we give thanks to God and offer encouragement and support for the work of those dedicated to assisting with outreach to immigrant and ethnic communities; and be it further

Resolved, that congregations be encouraged to equip their members to witness with God's Word to others in their community, including ethnic groups; and be it further

Resolved, that congregations be encouraged to seek helpful partnerships with other congregations and organizations which assist them in expanding their efforts among immigrant and ethnic communities; and be it further

Resolved, that congregations serving ethnic or changing communities be encouraged to develop intentional efforts to connect with people in meaningful ways which lead to faith conversations, interaction with God's Word and, by the power of the Holy Spirit, confession of faith, baptism and church membership, and be it finally

Resolved, that all congregations be encouraged to pray fervently and regularly that the Lord of the Church provide both faithful witnesses for the field and a harvest to eternity with Him.

Whereas, pastoral vacancies in the LC-MS are increasing with nearly 500 pastoral vacancies and over 400 being served by pastors emeriti; and

Whereas, our Lutheran identity, in accord with our Lutheran Confessions, needs to remain foundational to our Lutheran schools, yet there is a declining percentage of roster eligible educators currently serving in Lutheran schools; and

Whereas, we continue to support and affirm the work of Deaconesses, Directors of Christian Education, Directors of Christian Outreach, certified lay ministers; and

Whereas, the cost of education, including room and board, health insurance, and other expenses has increased over the past decade; and

Whereas, the amount of student loan debt has increased; and

Whereas, the Synod's financial support is continually declining in support of Master of Divinity programs of both seminaries and no longer provides financial support for church worker programs in the Concordia University System; therefore, be it

Resolved, that we pray to the Lord of the church to bring forth laborers in the harvest field (Matthew 9:38, Luke 10:2); and be it further

Resolved, that our congregations and schools be encouraged to identify and raise up the next generation of called workers and support them financially in obtaining their training; and be it further

Resolved, that the Lutheran Church - Missouri Synod be encouraged to study and explore options for church worker recruitment, retention, and financial support; and be it further

Resolved, that the Missouri District study and explore options for church worker recruitment, retention, and financial support; and bring a report of their findings to the 2021 Missouri District Convention, and be it finally

Resolved, that the Concordia University System and the Synod Office of Pastoral Education be encouraged to continue the study of and implementation of recommendations from the Blue Ribbon Task Force on Lutheran Schools and 13-03 Task Force on Future Church Leadership Needs for church worker recruitment, retention, and financial support.

chairman of the 2015 Floor Committee on Structure and Administration, Dr. Craig Ernstmeyer (school administrator and member of Board for Educational Services), James Weber (recently completed nine years on the Board of Directors) and Don Hugo (church administrator and member of the Board for Congregational Services); and

Whereas, the Structure Task Force used three key principles in their evaluation: efficiency, clarity of purpose and effective stewardship; and

Whereas, the Structure Task Force consulted with a number of individuals from within Missouri District and other districts and at the Synod level as part of their evaluation; and Whereas, the LCMS Commission on Constitutional Matters has approved the proposed changes to the District by-laws; and

Whereas, President Hagan presented the Task Force recommendations to thirteen circuit pastors gatherings prior to the final report of the Task Force; and

Whereas, the response to proposed by-law changes has been very positive; therefore, be it **Resolved**, that the Missouri District Convention adopt the following changes to the District by-laws.

- II.C.2. Upon recommendation from the president, the Board of Directors shall have the authority to...
- II.C.3. The Board of Directors may delegate to the president and others the authority to appoint and dismiss staff members, but the Board of Directors alone has the authority to dismiss a divinely called staff member.
- d. A committee of three laypersons from the Board of Directors shall be appointed II.D.1. as tellers by the secretary to tabulate the nomination results. The tellers shall report to the secretary the names of all Ministers of Religion – Ordained who have received at least five nominating votes for the Offices of President and First Vice President. The secretary shall report to the convention by means of the convention workbook the names and number of nominations of all Ministers of Religion – Ordained who have received at least one nomination for the Offices of President and First Vice President;
 - e. Groups and individuals within and without the district are urged to refrain from circularizing the district or areas thereof relative to favoritism in nominations for president or first vice president.
 - 2. Candidates for the Office of President and of First Vice President
 - a. Candidates for the Office of President and of First Vice President shall be in each instance the four Ministers of Religion – Ordained receiving the highest number of nominations in the nominating ballots of the congregations, provided they receive more than one nomination.
 - b. The secretary of the district shall notify each candidate and shall secure his approval in writing for inclusion of his name on the convention ballot. Each candidate shall reply within 10 days as to his willingness to serve as a nominee.
 - c. In the event of the death, declination, or unavailability of any candidate, the nominee having the next highest number of nominations shall become a candidate.

- f. The convention shall have the right to offer nominations from the floor. Any delegate making a nomination from the floor shall have secured prior written consent of the candidate whom he wishes to nominate. Such delegate shall immediately submit to the secretary of the district this document and written pertinent information concerning his nominee.
- II.E. 4. All Ministers of Religion Ordained and Ministers of Religion Commissioned conference committees of the Missouri District shall be directly responsible to the president. All Ministers of Religion Ordained and Ministers of Religion Commissioned shall attend their respective conferences on an annual basis (Synod Bylaw 4.8.2[d]).
- III.B. 3. Special meetings may be called by the chairman or upon request of three board members. Those calling a special meeting shall set the date of such meeting. The office of the president shall notify each board member of such special meeting and its purpose.

IV. A. DUTIES OF THE PRESIDENT

The president shall:

- 3. Be a member of the Board of Directors and serve as its chairman;
- 4. Convene the circuit visitors at least annually;
- 5. Be a non-voting ex-officio member of all boards and committees including those for professional conferences except the Committee on Nominations;

- 2. Keep the Board of Directors advised on fiscal matters, loans and interest policies, and matters of investment;
- 3. Be authorized to borrow money or make investments in the name of the district as directed by the Board of Directors;
- 4. Be responsible for adequate records of income and expenditures according to policies established by the Board of Directors;
- 5. Maintain a close working relationship with any staff responsible for finances;

IV.F.

The staff shall:

1. Function under the supervision of the president as outlined in their job description; VI.B.

The Constitution Committee shall:

4. Act in an advisory capacity to the district and the president in the interpretation of the district bylaws;

VII.A.

District reconcilers shall be appointed by the district Board of Directors in compliance with 1.10.10 ff. of the Synod Bylaws.

Article VIII - ELECTION AND APPOINTMENT PROCEDURES

A. GENERAL PROVISIONS

3. In making appointments, the Board of Directors and president shall give consideration to provide a cross-section of representation throughout the district.

VIII.B.

2. The president shall convene and orientate the Nominating Committee at least eighteen (18) months prior to the convention. The president shall appoint the chairman from among the elected members of the Nominating Committee.

VIII.C.2

Duties of the Committee on Elections:

- b. The election shall proceed according to the following order: president, first vice president, other vice presidents, secretary...
- f. The elections for the second, third, and fourth vice presidents shall proceed as follows.
 - 1. Nominations shall be by direct nominating ballot of eligible pastors from the district. Each voting delegate shall be entitled to place in nomination as many persons as there are vice presidents to be elected. The persons receiving the greatest number of nominations shall be the candidates in the election for vice presidents, the number of candidates to be four three times the number of offices to be filled.
 - 2. The rank of vice presidents shall be determined by the order of their election or, if more than one is elected in the same voting, by the number of votes received by each.
 - 3. In the election, each voting delegate shall be entitled to vote for as many candidates as there are offices to be filled. A candidate whose total vote equals or exceeds a majority of the number of delegates voting shall be declared elected.
 - 4. If more candidates receive a majority than there are offices to be filed, those receiving the greatest number of votes shall be declared elected.
 - 5. When a second or succeeding ballot is required for a majority, the candidates receiving the fewest votes shall be dropped from the ballot, leaving two candidates for each position to be filled.
 - 6. This procedure shall be followed until all the offices have been filled.

Article IX – OFFICIAL DISTRICT CONFERENCES

C. COMPOSITION OF OFFICIAL CONFERENCE COMMITTEES

1. The praesidium and three pastors, selected by the pastors' conference in cycle C, will serve as the planning committee, including the program and selection of speakers, for all district pastors' conferences.

The Ministers of Religion – Commissioned Educators' Conference Committee (Educators' Conference) shall consist of the president, assistant to the president – education, and representative educators from across the Missouri District (including high schools, elementary schools and early childhood programs) to be appointed by the president.

Whereas, the existence of multiple ministry boards requires additional need for coordination (e.g., Coordinating Council), adding a layer of complexity; therefore, be it

Resolved, that the bylaws of the Missouri District of the Lutheran Church–Missouri Synod be amended as follows.

- II.A. 3. The staff and the Council on Mission and Ministry shall be directly responsible to the president and shall report plans and major decisions for approval with power of appeal to the convention.
 - 4. The Council on Mission and Ministry and all committees shall make reports to each district convention.
 - 5. All officers, the Board of Directors, the Council on Mission and Ministry, and committees shall be ultimately responsible to the district convention.

II.E. BOARD, COUNCIL, AND COMMITTEES

- 1. The Board of Directors is directly responsible to the district convention.
- 2. The committees which are directly responsible to the district convention shall be:
 - a. A Constitution Committee (appointive)
 - b. A Committee on Nominations (elected)
 - c. A Committee of Elections (appointive)
- 3. The Council on Mission and Ministry is directly responsible to the president.
- 5. The president may appoint committees and task forces as required to assist the staff in their work.
- 6. All convention floor committees shall be directly responsible to the president.
- II.H. 5. The existing Board of Directors and other officers, council, commissions, and committees shall continue to function until the newly elected, re-elected, and appointed officers of the district and members of the council, commissions, and committees assume office.
 - 6. The newly elected members of the Board of Directors and council as well as other appointed board, council, and committee members shall attend whatever meetings are held in the interim, without vote, to become acquainted with their responsibilities and functions.

IV. A. DUTIES OF THE PRESIDENT

The president shall:

- 6. Designate one of the vice presidents as his representative to any commission or committee he may deem advisable;
- 10. Make sure that the district personnel, staff, boards, task forces, and committees are working together in harmony to implement the mission, vision and strategies adopted by the convention and the Board of Directors;
- 11. Be responsible for an up-to-date procedures manual, adequately indexed for recording procedures necessary for the effective and efficient operation of the convention and also for officers, board, council, committees, and district personnel;

IV. B. DUTIES OF THE VICE PRESIDENTS

The vice presidents shall:

- 1. Advise, assist or represent the president at his request or as may be provided by the district convention;
- 2. Serve in an advisory capacity as representatives of the president on the council and various committees as directed by the president.

IV. D. DUTIES OF THE TREASURER

The treasurer shall:

IV.F. DUTIES OF THE STAFF

The staff shall:

- 2. Assist congregations, board, council, committees, and task forces to further the dissemination of the Gospel;
- 3. Work cooperatively with the Synod's Offices of National and International Mission to assist district congregations to be involved in the worldwide dissemination of the Gospel;
- 4. Assist district officers, professional church workers, and congregation lay leaders as requested or assigned.

Article V - COUNCIL ON MISSION AND MINISTRY

A. RESPONSIBILITY

- 1. The council shall be responsible to the president.
- 2. The responsibilities of the council shall include the development of appropriate educational activities according to their functions as outlined in Article V section D.
- 3. The president may assign a vice president or a voting member of the Board of Directors to represent him on the council as an advisory member.
- 4. The president may assign district staff to advise the council.

B. MEMBERSHIP

Council members shall:

- 1. Be composed of two (2) Ministers of Religion Ordained, two (2) Ministers of Religion Commissioned, and two (2) laypersons, elected by the convention;
- 2. As many as three additional council members may be recommended by the council chairman, approved by the president and appointed by the Board of Directors;
- 3. Appointees to the council shall have a minimum of three years professional or volunteer experience appropriate to the council responsibilities.

C. REGULATIONS

The council shall:

- 1. Choose its chairman, vice-chairman, and secretary from those council members elected by the district convention at its first meeting after the district convention;
- 2. Report through its chairman to the president and provide a copy of its minutes for district files:
- 3. Meet as regularly as its responsibilities require;
- 4. Make a detailed report of its activities at each district convention.

FUNCTIONS D.

The council shall provide assistance to the president and staff of the district to:

- 1. Promote and implement convention resolutions relative to the congregations, schools and ordained and commissioned ministers of the district;
- 2. Oversee the planning and implementation of district events relative to support of congregations, including the areas of outreach, family life and youth;
- 3. "Assist and advise local congregations in the development and promotion of an adequate stewardship program" (Synod bylaw 4.6.1.a);
- 4. Make recommendations to the Board of Directors relative to congregational needs;
- 5. Work together with district staff to implement the mission, vision and strategies adopted by the Board of Directors.

Article VIII - ELECTION AND APPOINTMENT PROCEDURES

A. **GENERAL PROVISIONS**

1. The following shall be elected at each convention: The president... members of the Board of Directors, members of the Council on Mission and Ministry, the circuit visitors, and the Committee on Nominations.

 - 3. Laypersons to serve as... and the Council on Mission and Ministry. Duties of the Committee on Elections:
- b. The election shall proceed according to the following order: president, first vice president, other vice presidents... Board of Directors, Council on Mission and Ministry, the ratification of circuit visitors, and the committee on nominations.

Resolved, that the bylaws of the Missouri District of the Lutheran Church–Missouri Synod be amended as follows.

II.A.2. The president shall supervise the work program of the district.

II.B. OFFICERS

The elected officers shall be:

- 1. A full-time president
- 2. Four vice presidents
- 3. A secretary
- 4. A visitor for each circuit of the district

The appointed officer shall be a treasurer.

- II.C. 2. ... the Board of Directors shall have the authority to: issue divine calls;
- II.H. 2. In the interim, the newly elected president shall meet with the newly elected and/or re-elected vice presidents to assess the state of the district, to plan for the communication and carrying out of the resolutions adopted at the convention, to assign areas of responsibility to the vice presidents, to gather names and obtain information helpful for making wise appointments. He shall meet with the necessary district staff to discuss convention reports and actions, and to assess with them, and the financial officers, the financial status of the district and to estimate the financial resources available.
 - 3. The Board of Directors shall determine remuneration for the newly elected president during the interim period between election and installation.
 - 4. Remuneration for the outgoing president shall be continued for three months beyond the end of his term unless he is otherwise gainfully employed or has retired from full-time employment. Any extension beyond this period shall be at the discretion of the Board of Directors.

Article III – THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS

A. MEMBERSHIP

- 1. The Board of Directors shall consist of the following members, each with a vote:
 - a. The president of the district (Minister of Religion Ordained)
 - b. The first vice president of the district (Minister of Religion Ordained)
 - c. The secretary of the district (Minister of Religion Ordained)
 - d. Two (2) Ministers of Religion Ordained, elected at large
 - e. Two (2) Ministers of Religion Commissioned, elected at large
 - f. Three (3) laypersons, elected at large
 - g. The members of the Board of Directors elected by the convention shall appoint the treasurer of the district at the first meeting of the Board of Directors following the convention. The treasurer shall be a layperson.

- h. The members of the Board of Directors elected by the convention "shall also have the authority to choose to appoint to the board up to three voting lay members from the district's congregations to obtain additional skill sets (legal, finance, investment, administration, etc.)" (Synod bylaw 4.5.1).
- i. Elected members of the Board of Directors, other than the secretary, the president, and the first vice president, shall serve six (6) year terms. The term of appointive members of the Board of Directors shall expire at the installation of a newly elected Board of Directors.

B. ORGANIZATION

- 1. The secretary shall be the Secretary of the Board of Directors. The members of the Board of Directors elected at the convention shall elect the chairman, vice chairman, and such other officers of the board as deemed necessary. The chairman and vice chairman shall be elected from those members of the Board of Directors elected by the convention.
- 6. In the event of a vacancy on the Board of Directors, the remaining members of the board elected by the convention may elect a successor for the unexpired term.
- 7. The Board of Directors shall establish, maintain, and follow policy and procedure manuals.
- 8. Special committees may be appointed within the Board of Directors at its discretion.

C. AUTHORITY

The authority of the Board of Directors shall be in accordance with Synod Bylaw 4.5.1.

D. DUTIES

Except as otherwise expressly provided in these bylaws, the Board of Directors shall hold responsibility for the district between conventions. To this end it shall:

- 1. At least annually review and when necessary revise the vision, mission, and strategies it has formulated in order to establish short, mid and long term goals through the president;
- 2. Receive and act on the recommendations of the president and committees assigned by the Board of Directors;
- 3. Coordinate the district's work with Synod's; 4.5.1 (c)
- 4. Submit proposed annual support goals to the congregations;
- 5. Establish an annual budget of the district on the basis of the share of the Lord's work assumed by the congregations;
- 6. Balance the budget as nearly as possible and be authorized to do any and all such things as may be necessary or expedient to accomplish this end;
- 7. Acquire, hold, lease, mortgage, pledge, sell, convey, or otherwise dispose of property, real or personal tangible or intangible, in behalf of the Missouri District;
- 8. Provide for adequate support personnel as well as policies and procedures for the operation of the district office;

- 9. Determine and define the number, role, function, and responsibility of staff members;
- 10. Report to the convention of the district;
- 11. Approve the site of the district convention upon recommendation of the president;
- 12. Engage a CPA firm to audit the financial records of the district at least annually or at any time during the year as it deems advisable;
- 13. Engage legal counsel to advise the district regarding legal matters;
- 14. Provide for the bonding of all officers handling district funds;
- 15. Appoint an archivist;
- Conduct, supervise, and manage all affairs of the district not otherwise assigned. 16.

Article VIII - ELECTION AND APPOINTMENT PROCEDURES

A. **GENERAL PROVISIONS**

The following shall be elected at each convention: The president, the vice presidents, the secretary, members of the Board of Directors

VIII.B.

- 4. Duties of Committee on Nominations:
 - c. The Committee on Nominations shall circularize the Ministers of Religion Ordained and congregations of the district for names and qualifications of Ministers of Religion – Ordained, Ministers of Religion – Commissioned, and laypersons to serve as secretary, members of the Board of Directors....
 - 1. Ministers of Religion Ordained to serve as district secretary... at-large member of the Board of Directors
 - 2. Ministers of Religion Commissioned to serve as at-large members of the Board of Directors....
 - 3. Laypersons to serve as-members of the Board of Directors....
 - d. The committee shall endeavor to represent all the areas of the district in nominating at least two candidates for each elected office or position with the exception of the president, the vice presidents, and the circuit visitors. The committee shall further endeavor to represent the needed skill sets for the Board of Directors (legal, finance, investment, administration) and the Council on Mission and Ministry. The convention reserves the right to place additional names on the ballot. No candidate shall be nominated by the nominating committee for more than one position with the exception of membership on the Committee on Nominations.

d. The election shall proceed according to the following order: president, first vice president, other vice presidents... secretary, Board of Directors....

Resolution 4-04 (Workbook pages 92-93)

To Amend District Bylaws to Provide Continuity for the Board of Directors and Council on Mission and Ministry

Whereas, the Missouri District Board of Directors began a process of evaluating its structure in 2015; and

Whereas, after an initial review of the structure, the Board appointed a Structure Task Force to make recommendations to the Board in advance of the 2018 Missouri District Convention; and

Whereas, the Structure Task Force was composed of Dr. Kevin Golden (chairman, former District Vice-President and Service Board Chairman), Rev. Tyler Arnold (current circuit visitor and chairman of the 2015 Floor Committee on Structure and Administration, Dr. Craig Ernstmeyer (school administrator and member of Board for Educational Services), James Weber (recently completed nine years on the Board of Directors) and Don Hugo (church administrator and member of the Board for Congregational Services); and

Whereas, the Structure Task Force used three key principles in their evaluation: efficiency, clarity of purpose and effective stewardship; and

Whereas, the Structure Task Force consulted with a number of individuals from within Missouri District and other districts and at the Synod level as part of their evaluation; and

Whereas, the LCMS Commission on Constitutional Matters has approved the proposed changes to the District by-laws; and

Whereas, President Hagan presented the Task Force recommendations to thirteen circuit pastors gatherings prior to the final report of the Task Force; and

Whereas, the response to proposed by-law changes has been very positive; and

Whereas, continuity from triennium to triennium promotes efficiency in the board and council in service to the mission and ministry of the district; and

Whereas, existing bylaws do not ensure such continuity; and

Whereas, it is essential to have clarity regarding the transition for board and council from one triennium to the next; therefore, be it

Resolved, that the bylaws of the Missouri District of the Lutheran Church–Missouri Synod be amended as follows.

II.F. TERMS OF OFFICE

1. The term of office of the president, vice presidents, secretary, and circuit visitors shall be three years. The term of office for members of the Board of Directors shall be six years. The term of office for members of the Council on Mission and Ministry shall be three years.

- 2. The president may serve an unlimited number of terms. No individual may be elected or appointed as secretary after three consecutive terms until at least three years have elapsed. No individual may be elected or appointed to the Board of Directors after two consecutive terms until at least three years have elapsed. No individual may be elected or appointed to the Council on Mission and Ministry after three consecutive terms until at least three years have elapsed. A vice president after three consecutive terms, regardless of ranking, may not be elected to any other vice president position until after three years have elapsed. Service for a period of one half or more of an unexpired term shall be counted as a full term.
- 3. The terms of office of members of appointive committees shall be three years. The terms of office shall begin on the date of their induction and terminate at the induction of their successors after the next convention.
- 4. No individual may be elected or appointed to the same committee after three consecutive terms until at least three years have elapsed. Service for a period of one half or more of an unexpired term shall be counted as a full term.

II.G. INSTALLATION AND INDUCTION

- 1. The installation of the president and the induction of the vice presidents, secretary, Council on Mission and Ministry, and Board of Directors, elected at the convention shall be held within eight weeks following the election and shall be announced as soon as possible after the convention.
- 2. Circuit visitors shall be inducted at the conclusion of the convention.
- 3. The appointive members shall be inducted at the next meeting of their respective board or council.

Article VIII - ELECTION AND APPOINTMENT PROCEDURES

A. **GENERAL PROVISIONS**

- 4. The 2018 district convention shall elect to a six-year term on the Board of Directors one (1) Minister of Religion — Ordained, elected at large, one (1) Minister of Religion — Commissioned, elected at large, and two (2) laypersons, elected at large. The 2018 district convention shall further elect to a three-year term on the Board of Directors one (1) Minister of Religion — Ordained, elected at large, one (1) Minister of Religion — Commissioned, elected at large, and one (1) layperson, elected at large.
- 5. The 2018 district convention shall elect to a six-year term on the Council on Mission and Ministry one (1) Minister of Religion — Ordained, one (1) Minister of Religion — Commissioned, and one (1) layperson. The 2018 district convention shall further elect to a three-year term on the Council on Mission and Ministry one (1) Minister of Religion — Ordained, one (1) Minister of Religion — Commissioned, and one (1) layperson.

Resolution 4-05 (Workbook page 94)

To Realign Circuits

Whereas, districts of the Lutheran Church-Missouri Synod are to organize member congregations into circuits that walk together for "mutual care, support, advice, study, ecclesiastical encouragement, service, coordination, resources, and counsel..." (Synod Handbook 5.1.1); and

Whereas, circuits are "structures for congregations to review decisions of the Synod, to motivate one another to action, and to shape and suggest new directions" (Synod Handbook 1.3.6) and these functions are better fulfilled and coordinated within a circuit that reflects the congregational community context; and

Whereas, circuits are to be established according to geographical criteria (Synod Handbook 5.1.2); and

Whereas, the proposed changes preserve each affected circuit's eligibility to send delegates to district or national conventions (see Synod Handbook 3.1.2(a)...; and

Whereas, the congregations and circuits affected by the proposed changes have all given their consent; therefore, be it

Resolved, that Trinity Lutheran Church located at 206 A Street, Creighton, Missouri be transferred from Sedalia Visitation and Electoral Circuit (24) to Kansas City South Visitation and Electoral Circuit (13); and be it further

Resolved, that Our Savior Lutheran Church located at 107 S. Elder Street, Buffalo, Missouri be transferred from Sedalia Visitation and Electoral Circuit (24) to Springfield Visitation and Electoral Circuit (26); and be it finally

Resolved, that Holy Cross Lutheran Church located at 8945 Veterans Memorial Parkway, O'Fallon, Missouri be transferred from St. Charles Visitation and Electoral Circuit (16) to Wentzville Visitation and Electoral Circuit (28).

Resolution 4-06 (Workbook pages 94-95)

To Memorialize Synod to Revise Eligibility to Serve as Circuit Visitor

Whereas, Synod bylaw 4.3.1 states "a circuit visitor for each circuit established by the district shall be elected from the clergy roster of the district"; and

Whereas, Synod bylaw 5.2.2(d) restricts eligibility to serve as a circuit visitor to "nominated pastors serving congregations and emeriti pastors"; and

Whereas, many rostered pastors of the Synod serving in capacities other than parish ministry are well qualified but deemed ineligible by Synod bylaw 5.2.2(d) to serve as circuit visitor; therefore, be it

Resolved, that the Missouri District in convention memorialize Synod in convention to revise Bylaw 5.2.2(d) to read "(d) All nominated pastors who are on the clergy roster of the district whose names were nominated prior to the day of the circuit forum shall be eligible for election...".



Brothers and sisters in Christ, I am honored and humbled by your confidence in me to continue in this office. I have learned much during these past three years. In some respects, each day is a struggle because of my own weaknesses, my own sinful flesh. At the same time, God's Word is a constant source of comfort as I remember His faithfulness. Christ Jesus is truly the faithful witness, and the Lord uses all of His servants for His appointed work- sinners who demonstrate His incomparable grace.

Three years ago, as I stood before the convention, I was quite naive about what I was getting myself into. Now I have a much greater understanding of the joys and challenges of this office. To me, this office is much like serving as a parish pastor, and that is how I have approached it. Just like being a pastor, there are parts of the office that bring me great joy. I love going to congregations and celebrating anniversaries. I love the opportunity to visit with congregations that are excited about welcoming a new pastor. I love Call Days. Baptisms were always my favorite work as a parish pastor. I do not get to carry out that responsibility these days, but the joy of being at the Call Services at both seminaries- those are two days that I look forward to on my calendar each year.

There are parts of the office that are a challenge and at times that I do not always look forward to, particularly difficult situations where there is great conflict, and meetings that seemingly never end. Just like being a parish pastor, there are parts that are joys and there are parts that are challenges. I strive to approach the responsibilities of this office prayerfully and guided by the Word of God, applying Law and Gospel in my supervision and encouraging our congregations, schools, and church workers to be faithful faithful to God's Word and faithful witnesses in our changing world.

For the upcoming triennium, we will continue our focus on caring for church workers. One of the most exciting things this past year was a retreat for new Lutheran school teachers to the district. Retention of our new teachers is vitally important. If we can keep them in those first five years, it is likely that they will become those generational teachers with significant impact on families. We are thankful for the work of our schools' office, and Alan Freeman in beginning that process. We intend to continue the support of our church workers.


We also intend to continue the Plus One Initiative, and by God's grace it is our hope to move from addition to multiplication. As I reflect on these three years, there are two areas that I think need significant further attention. First is greater support for our Lutheran schools. Our schools are facing significant challenges today. If you think about the changes going on in the culture, they have a tremendous effect on our schools. Our parents come with a very consumer-oriented mindset; rather than wanting to receive a Christ-centered education, they are more motivated by other desires. We also have other pressures as well; finance is always one of those, striving for excellence in our education, keeping up with the technological advances, maintaining the facilities, and retaining faithful Lutheran school teachers. This is a challenge that we will focus on; we will bring together needed support and resources for our principals, for our school boards, for our teachers, and for our families for the work of the Missouri District. Secondly, we also intend to address the need for greater support for our congregations and schools in the area of youth and family ministry, specifically the retaining of children and youth in our congregations. In 1960, LCMS congregations confirmed 91% of children who had been baptized thirteen years earlier. In 2013, LCMS congregations only confirmed 47% of children who had

been baptized thirteen years earlier. Quite often we only want to focus on that period of adolescence of junior-high, high school and young adult years. However, part of what we see here is children that we baptize, we are losing them before confirmation. We need to work together, and we need to identify some of the best practices or some of the best resources that are out there. Pastors, DCEs, deaconesses, Lutheran school teachers, early childhood programs and families need to work together to retain our children and youth. These are two areas that we wish to address more in the next three years.

I would like to thank the staff of the Missouri District. In the last three years we have seen significant transitions in our office. I am very thankful to God for the members of the staff who have joined us and who continued in the Missouri District Office. These are the people that you talk to on the phone, these are the people that you receive emails from, these are the people that walk you through the registration of the convention, these are the people that come and meet with your school boards, and these are the people that come and assist in a difficult situation. I am so very thankful for all of the members of our staff; they are supportive and committed to the congregations. There are lots of other things that they could be doing, there are lots of other ways that they can serve, but they believe in the work of supporting pastors, lay leaders, congregations, and schools in the Missouri District. They have served us faithfully and well.

Lastly, I would like to thank my family. These three years have meant significant changes for them also and they have faced them with patience and grace. So, I give thanks to Jill, Caroline, and Jack for their support and love.

As I said earlier, our work is a work in progress. On this side of eternity our work is never done, but please know that I will strive to be a faithful witness in my service to Christ and the Missouri District. Thank you so much for your confidence. God's blessings to all of you and your service in the church. God be with you.
