Kris Schuldt Wins LERT Award

Lutheran Early Response Teams are Lutheran volunteers across the state (and country) that are trained in disaster response. Rain, floods, tree damage, earthquakes—whatever the disaster they come prepared to help clean up free of charge to those affected. LERT's training serves to restore more than property damage, though, they also are trained in mercy ministry, learning how to pray and be a spiritual support in times of crisis.

The impact of the efforts of these LERT groups is great. Their efforts were recognized at the LCMS National Convention this summer. Resolution 3-04A stated "To Commend and Give Thanks for Synod Work regarding Disaster Response", and it passed unanimously.

Across Missouri, there are many active LERT groups. Sometimes these groups even travel to other states to help with disasters. Kris Schuldt serves as the Missouri District Disaster Response Coordinator and leads an active LERT group. Kris's heart for ministry and service shines through in his tireless efforts this past year.

Kris was awarded the "2023 Disaster Response Servant Award" from LCMS Disaster Response. "Kris was selected from our entire pool of volunteers due to his numerous responses and leadership in the past year," says LCMS Director of Disaster Training Rev. Michael Meyer. "He volunteered over 1500 [hours] in the past 12 months (more than double the next closest [candidate]), primarily in response to flooding in O'Fallon and St. Peters last July. He also led his team in flood cleanup at St. Matthews in St. Louis and wind events in New Melle and various other locations in the western STL metro region."

Congratulations Kris on all your hardwork and thank you for your efforts to help those impacted by natural disaster!

Interested in helping with disaster response? LERT volunteers must have at least the basic training. Trainings occur several times throughout the year and in different parts of the state. The next basic training is November 4 at Immanuel Lutheran Church in St. Charles. LCMS adults and high school youth (aged 14-17) are welcome to attend. Held at a location near you, the E2: Equip and Encourage Conferences are morning conferences that serve as a support and training for congregations and their ministries. Presented by Missouri District staff and leaders from across Missouri, sessions include topics like Shared Youth Ideas, Family Discipleship, Stewardship Resources, Intergenerational Faith Formation, Serving Your Community, and more.

Held on Saturdays from 9 a.m. to 12:15 p.m., the conferences are free to attend, and light refreshments and coffee will be provided. The dates and locations of the conferences are:

This way, people can divide up, attend many breakouts, then come back together after the conference, perhaps on the ride home or over lunch, and discuss what works best for their ministry.

New Church Worker Orientation

The New Church Worker Orientation was held August 24–25. This orientation had an all day bus tour with 21 vicars, interns, and newly called workers seeing different churches and missions across the greater St. Louis area. The training continued the second day at the Missouri District Offices with 11 newly called workers. During lunch, these church workers got to eat and meet with current church workers in their field. A great introduction into the next phase of these workers' vocation.





Circuit Visitor Training

In August, a circuit visitor meeting was held in Columbia. There is time for fellowship, but the primary purpose for these biannual trainings is to equip the circuit visitors to be able to carry out the functions assigned to them by the Synodical Handbook: church and pastoral visitation, call processes, installations, retirements, circuit meetings and convocations, etc.

"These trainings help to equip the Circuit Visitors in their responsibilities to circuit congregations and pastors. It also provides time to encourage them as they deal with many challenges from a high number of vacancies to congregational conflicts to worker health issues. The New Worker Orientation is a great time to meet and encourage new workers to the Missouri District, to support them in new responsibilities and to educate them in how the District can be a resource for their ministries."
