Title: Certified Teacher Job Description

Accountable to: Administrator/Principal Employment Terms – 10 months / August 1 to May 31

Qualifications

- Have or be willing to obtain a valid teaching certificate from the State of Missouri within 2 years.
- Synodically trained or if not, will be required to start a colloquy program within 2 years and complete it within 5 years.

The faculty of Saxony Lutheran High School shall be spiritual, educational, and professional leaders of the school, their respective churches and the community. They shall reflect and commit to the school's purpose and overall ministry and well-being of Saxony Lutheran High School. Each teacher shall be a member in good standing of their church.

Spiritual Responsibilities

- Integrate Biblical principles throughout the curriculum.
- Practice a regular and exemplary corporate worship life.
- Be accountable and follow the spirit of Matthew 5 and 18 to resolve differences with students, parents, colleagues and others.
- Practice appropriate corporate prayer with the students.
- Emphasize to students the reality of their self-worth in Christ.

Educational Responsibilities

- Teach faithfully the Word of God as understood and taught by the LCMS.
- Teach classes as assigned, following prescribed scope and sequence as scheduled by the administrator/principal.
- Demonstrate mastery of all subject material.
- Plan broadly through the use of semester, quarterly and daily lesson plans.
- Respect the intrinsic value of each child through attention to his/her academic, physical, social, spiritual and developmental needs.
- Use a variety of instructional aids, methods and materials that will provide for creative teaching to reach each child in the classroom.
- Integrate the use of technology appropriately in the classroom.
- Follow the school-approved discipline policies and procedures.
