"Faithful Teaching About Stewardship"

There are certain topics that pastors may be uncomfortable addressing in their preaching and teaching. However, faithfulness to the Lord and His Word means confronting even the hard topics whether corporately through preaching and teaching or individually through pastoral care. Christians are often uninformed if no one has ever intentionally taught them what the Scriptures have to say about the specific topic. Stewardship is frequently one such topic.

Presiden's

Many congregations are struggling in this particular area. For whatever reason, pastors and church leaders have been hesitant to address it in preaching and Bible classes. If our congregations are to be shaped and formed by the Word of God, then we need to confront this teaching of God's Word directly. It means confronting the sinful attitudes that often underlie the practice of our personal stewardship but also providing clear Christ-centered teaching about the gifts that we receive from God's gracious providing.

Pastors Nathan Meador and Heath Curtis wrote a small book, "Stewardship for the Care of Souls" that helps church leaders lay out a plan for addressing stewardship in the congregation. Pastor Curtis writes, "Changing the stewardship culture in a congregation is a big job. It must be based on and flow from the biblical message, and it must be approached with patience and wisdom." (p. 68-69)

My prayer is that pastors and church leaders will try to change the culture by teaching the whole counsel of God based upon His Word. There are good resources out there to assist congregations. One of the greatest challenges for church workers today is the high cost of ministry education and mounting college debt which creates financial stress. When personal debt distracts pastors and called workers from their work, congregations and schools suffer, and the result is that people don't hear about Jesus. MinistryFOCUS is a volunteer non-profit Recognized Service Organization (RSO) of The Lutheran Church—Missouri Synod that believes that the realities of educational debt negatively and irreparably harm ministries and congregations. Their goal is to raise money and award grants to help reduce and eliminate financial burdens, allowing ministry leaders to... well, focus on ministry.

On January 31, 2024, MinistryFOCUS proudly awarded \$165,000 in grants to 55 LCMS church workers in 19 states. Each individual \$3,000 grant will provide financial assistance to relieve the burdensome debt of pastors and other called workers. Since 2015, MinistryFOCUS has awarded 313 grants, totaling \$810,000 to pastors, Lutheran school teachers, directors of Christian outreach (DCOs), directors of Christian education (DCEs), and missionaries. Rev. Ken Krueger, President and Chairman of the Board of MinistryFOCUS relates, "Each year when I read the applications, I am struck by the dedication of so many of our called workers, even in the face of challenging financial realities. We pray that the grants we can award help rostered church workers focus on ministry, so that faith is strengthened and more people come to know Jesus Christ as Lord and Savior."



One recipient of a grant wrote, "Thank you so much [for the grant toward my student loans.] I am currently teaching full-time and working a second job to help pay back my student loans and some life expectancies. This grant will allow me to use Dave Ramsey's Debt Snowball Plan, helping me get out of debt sooner and eventually quitting my second job. That will "snowball" into having more time for re-energizing for ministry. Know that you have been in my prayers of thanksgiving, and I appreciate this very much."

Rostered church workers in need of debt relief can apply for the grants at the <u>MinistryFOCUS website</u> in Fall 2025 for 2026 grant awards. 


