Guest Speakers

Rev. Peter K. Lange | LCMS First Vice President



As first Vice President and a member of the Praesidium of The Lutheran Church—Missouri Synod (LCMS), the Rev. Peter K. Lange assists the president in carrying out his responsibilities and chairs the colloquy committees for both the pastoral ministry and commissioned ministry. Lange was elected to this position in 2019 and re-elected in 2023. He also serves as an ex officio member of the LCMS Board of Directors and the LCMS Commission on Theology and Church Relations and is the Synod president's representative on the Concordia Seminary, St. Louis, Board of Regents.

Previously, Lange served as president of the LCMS Kansas District (2015–2019). Prior to that, he served as senior pastor at St. John's Lutheran Church,

Topeka, Kan. (1999–2015), and associate pastor at St. Paul's Lutheran Church, Concordia, Mo. (1990–1999).

Born in Houston, Texas, Lange graduated from Concordia University, River Forest, Ill., in 1984 and from Concordia Theological Seminary, Fort Wayne, Ind., with a Master of Divinity in 1988. Lange also earned a Master of Sacred Theology degree in 1998 from Concordia Theological Seminary.

Lange has also served the church as secretary of the Council of Presidents (2018–2019), a member of the 2016 Resolution 13-01A Task Force "To Extol and Equip the Blessed Partnership between the Royal Priesthood and the Office of the Public Ministry," a chairman for Synod floor committees in 2016 and 2019, and a member of numerous boards and committees for the Missouri and Kansas districts from 1992–2015. Lange has also participated in short-term mission trips to England, Czech Republic, Germany, and South Africa.

Lange and his wife, Marcia, live in St. Louis. They have four married daughters and 12 grandchildren.

Rev. Benjamin T. Ball | LCMS Second Vice President



The Rev. Benjamin T. Ball is second Vice President and a member of the Praesidium of The Lutheran Church—Missouri Synod (LCMS). He was elected sixth Vice President in 2019, and re-elected and ranked second Vice President in 2023, representing the church's Central Region.

Ball is the senior pastor of St. Paul Lutheran Church and School in Hamel, Ill., where he was called in 2012. He previously served St. Luke's Lutheran Church, Dedham, Mass. (1999–2004), and St. Paul's Lutheran Church and School, Brookfield, Ill. (2004–2012).

He has served as the second Vice President of the LCMS Southern Illinois District (2018–2019), several terms as a circuit visitor in both the Northern Illinois and Southern Illinois districts, and as chairman of the Synod's Committee on Nominations (2019–2022).

Ball currently serves on the Board of Regents of Concordia University, Nebraska, Seward, Neb. He formerly served as a member of the Board of Directors of Metro-East Lutheran High School of Edwardsville, Ill. (2017–2019). He is a frequent presenter at conferences discussing preaching, liturgy, the fraternal bonds of pastors, and

the pastoral task in the Lutheran school. Ball is also the head coach of the St. Paul Lutheran Squires boys basketball team.

Originally from Richmond, Mich., he is a product of LCMS schools since kindergarten. He received a B.A. from Concordia University, River Forest, Ill., in 1995, and in 1999 was granted the M.Div. from Concordia Seminary, St. Louis.

An avid outdoorsman, he resides in the church parsonage with his wife, Serena, and their five children.

Rev. Dr. Kevin Golden | Essayist



Dr. Kevin Golden is associate professor of Exegetical Theology, dean of Theological Research and Publication, and director of Resident Field Education at Concordia Seminary, St. Louis. He joined the faculty in 2021.

He previously served as pastor of Village Lutheran Church, Ladue, Mo. (2009–21), and as pastor of Grace Lutheran Church, Holts Summit, Mo. (2002–09) during which time he helped found and taught at Calvary Lutheran High School in Jefferson City. Golden earned his Doctor of Philosophy (Ph.D.) and his Master of Divinity (M.Div.) from Concordia Seminary (2010, 1999). In 1995, Golden received a Bachelor of Arts in antiquities and religious studies, graduating summa cum laude in the Honors College at Missouri State University in Springfield, Mo.

Golden taught at Calvary Lutheran High School, Jefferson City, Mo. (2005–09). He also served as a guest instructor at Concordia Theological Seminary, Fort Wayne, Ind. (2007, 2009), and at Concordia Seminary (2000–02; 2009–14; 2017–21) teaching Old Testament courses, Greek and Hebrew.

Golden's research experience includes Hosea, biblical usage of the divine name, Genesis 6-9, Jonah, the Book of the Twelve (Minor Prophets) and biblical intertextuality.

He is the author of "Blessed Be His Name: Revealing the Sacred Names of God" (Concordia Publishing House, 2021), "God's Own Son Is Born A Child" (Concordia Publishing House, 2019) and "LifeLight: Minor Prophets" (Concordia Publishing House, 2009). He contributed to the festschrift, "The Mercy of God in the Cross of Christ: Essays on Mercy in Honor of Glenn Merritt" (LCMS, 2016). He is a frequent contributor to the "Concordia Theological Quarterly" and "Concordia Pulpit Resources."

Golden is a member of the Society of Biblical Literature (2003-present) and joined the Evangelical Theological Society in 2022. He served as the second Vice President of the LCMS Missouri District (2012–15; 2018–22) and has served on the district's finance committee and as an advisory member of the district's Board of Directors and for the Board for Family Life and Youth Ministry. He has served in a variety of roles for Humanitri, St. Louis, including serving on the Board of Directors (2013–20); chairman of the advancement committee (2016–17); chairman of the jail chaplaincy committee (2017–19); and as secretary of the board (2018–20). He also has served on a number of other organizational boards, and in pastoral roles such as chaplain and adviser.

Golden lives in suburban St. Louis with his wife, Joy. Their union has been blessed with seven living children.

Standing Rules

- 1. The Chair shall see that the agenda is followed as closely as possible. The Chair may deviate from the agenda when necessary or expedient.
- 2. Delegates must wear their badges whenever the convention is in session and may only sit in their designate sections.
- 3. In order to promote an orderly and non-distracting convention atmosphere, the following guidance shall apply to the use of electronic equipment, including wired and wireless communication devices, including laptops, tablets, cell phones, pagers, PDAs, or other similar devices. In all cases where use is permitted, the sound-producing capabilities of such devices shall not be used. Except as approved by convention staff, personal power cords shall not be allowed on the convention floor.

- 4. Announcements should be sent via convention page to the Chair's assistant next to the dais.
- 5. Resolutions shall be prioritized by Floor Committees and normally shall be presented to the convention in numerical sequence.
- 6. The preface, preamble, rationale, and whereas sections shall be regarded as integral parts of the resolutions and therefore subject to the same consideration and adoption as the main motion.
- 7. It shall be the discretion of the Chairman or presenting member of the floor committee to read the preface, preamble, rationale, and whereas sections of resolutions from Floor Committees that are printed in *Today's Business*. In addition, the Chair of the convention is not required to read each resolution as he states the questions and then as he calls for the vote.
- 8. Ordinarily, questions of privilege (or point of personal privilege) shall be addressed in writing and sent by convention page to the chair's assistant next to the dais.
- 9. Voting shall be by voice vote or by an electronic keypad, except when the Chair deems it necessary to use some other method. Voting by electronic keypad shall be deemed to be a division of the assembly.
- 10. All non-voting advisory delegates may participate in debate, but may not nominate candidates, make motions, or vote.

- 11. Delegates wishing to address the Convention, when recognized by the Chair, shall state their names and the name of the congregation or entity of the Synod they represent.
- 12. A microphone queue list will be enacted for every debatable motion considered by the assembly. Each time a debatable motion is considered by the assembly, a new microphone queue list will be created and the queue list from any previous motion will be cleared. All queue entrees will be addressed as they appear in the queue order.
- 13. No delegate may speak in any debate longer than two (2) minutes per speech. No delegate may speak more than twice on the same motion on the same day and may not speak a second time until all delegates desiring to speak have had the opportunity. The Chair shall discretion to make exceptions to this rule. When a Floor Committee is called on to answer a question or to give information, this rule may not apply.
- 14. A delegate who speaks on an issue may not move to call the question at the close of his or her speech.
- 15. Whenever possible, substitute resolutions and amendments to proposed resolutions shall be submitted to *Today's Business* for publication prior to convention consideration of the resolutions to which they pertain. When this is not possible, as in the course of discussion, one written copy of the proposed amendment shall be provided to the Secretary after it is offered from the floor.
- 16. Missouri Rule: A summary for every proposed or amended resolution must include how it will be carried out, a delineation or who may be assigned the responsibility for carrying out the resolution, and finally an estimated cost [or savings] to the District.
- 17. Whenever an amendment is offered from the floor that seeks to make editorial or other helpful suggestions to a pending resolution coming from a floor committee, the chair of the Floor Committee shall have the option of accepting such an amendment. If it is accepted, then the amendment is made without further debate or formal vote of the assembly.
- 18. If a substitute motion is offered and seconded, the presenter shall be offered two minutes to provide the rationale for offering it and a member of the Floor Committee shall be offered two minutes to present rationale for why the committee believes the original motion is to be preferred, after which the convention shall decide by majority vote without debate whether or not to consider the substitute. If the decision is in the affirmative and if the substitute motion is subsequently adopted, the original motion fails. If the substitute motion does not receive favorable action either to consider or adopt, the original motion is again considered. (This is the so-called "Behnken Rule" for addressing substitute motions.)
- 19. While any voting delegate may call the question at any time, the question shall be called by the Chair after 20 minutes of debate on any question. The Chair shall also call for a vote on the close of the debate (2/3 majority required) when in his judgment the assembly has heard sufficient speaking on both sides of the issue.
- 20. The Chair shall have the right to inquire of the assembly at any point of its readiness to vote.
- 21. During the final day of the convention, the President shall have the privilege of calling up for action those resolutions which in his judgment must be acted upon before adjournment.
- 22. Resolutions prepared by the Floor Committees, which are not acted upon by the convention before adjournment, die.
- 23. Unless covered by these Special Standing Rules, parliamentary procedure shall be governed by the most recent edition of *Robert's Rules of Order*.

Basic Parliamentary Principles

- 1. A District Delegate Convention is a parliamentary assembly called to deliberate and to make decisions. From time to time it defines the privileges, the rights, and the duties of the members of the District and sets up or changes the framework of District organization. It hears the reports of its officers, boards, and committees as to what they have done with their constitutional and convention directives and receives and passes on proposals for their future activity.
- 2. All voting delegates have equal rights, privileges, and obligations.
- 3. The vote of the majority decides. The will of a District Convention is determined by the taking of a vote.
- 4. Free discussion of every proposition or resolution presented for decision is an established right for all delegates, voting and advisory. The Convention has the right to decide when it has heard sufficient discussion. This right, however, should be exercised with restraint.
- 5. Both proponents and opponents of a given proposal have rights which must be safeguarded. The decision belongs to the majority, but the right to discuss, the right to be heard, and the right to oppose should be upheld. A member of the majority on one question is often a member of the minority on another.
- 6. Delegates may always ask for information or clarification.
- 7. The simplest and most direct parliamentary procedure for accomplishing a purpose should be followed rather than taking devious routes and multiplying technicalities.
- 8. Every delegate has the right to know what question is before the convention and what its effect will be, for every action taken by a deliberative body should be taken knowledgeably.

Article IV - DUTIES OF OFFICERS AND STAFF

A. DUTIES OF THE PRESIDENT

- 9 The president shall:
 - 1. Exercise ecclesiastical supervision over the doctrine, practice, life, and administration of all elected, called, and appointed officers and the Ministers of Religion Ordained, Ministers of Religion Commissioned, and certified church workers, lay, of the district;
 - 2. Perform the duties set forth in Synod Bylaw 4.4 and Synod Constitution Article XII and especially serve as chief executive of the district who leads the Board of Directors in the formulation of the district's vision, mission and strategies and in their implementation;
 - 3. Be a member of the Board of Directors;
 - 4. Convene the circuit visitors at least annually;
 - 5. Be a non-voting ex-officio member of all committees including those for professional conferences except the Committee on Nominations;
 - 6. Designate one of the vice presidents as his representative to any commission or committee he may deem advisable;
 - 7. Make such appointments as are directed by the district through its bylaws or resolutions;
 - 8. Appoint all necessary committees and an assistant secretary for the convention;
 - 9. Be responsible that the resolutions of the Synod, and district and Board of Directors are implemented and coordinated;
 - 10. Make sure that the district personnel, staff, boards, task forces, and committees are working together in harmony to implement the mission, vision and strategies adopted by the convention and the Board of Directors;
 - 11. Be responsible for an up-to-date procedures manual necessary for the effective and efficient operation of the district; adequately indexed for recording procedures necessary for the effective and efficient operation of the convention and also for officers, board, council, committees, and district personnel;
 - 12. Be responsible for procedures necessary for the effective and efficient operation of the convention:
 - 13. Have responsibility for supervising the staff according to their respective assignment of duties. He may appoint members of the staff to assist him;

 - 5. The president may appoint committees and task forces as required to assist the staff in their work.
 - 6. All convention floor committees shall be directly responsible to the president.

Article III – THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS

A. MEMBERSHIP

- 1. The Board of Directors shall consist of the following members, all with a vote: The Board of Directors shall consist of the following members, all with a vote: president, the first vice president, the secretary of the district elected by the convention, seven (7) members elected by the convention, a treasurer appointed by the Board of Directors, and up to three (3) members appointed by the Board of Directors to fill needed areas of expertise:
 - a. The president of the district (Minister of Religion Ordained)
 - b. The first vice president of the district (Minister of Religion Ordained)
 - c. The secretary of the district (Minister of Religion Ordained)
 - d. Two (2) Ministers of Religion Ordained, elected at large
 - e. Two (2) Ministers of Religion Commissioned, elected at large
 - f. Three (3) laypersons, elected at large
 - g. The members of the Board of Directors elected by the convention shall appoint the treasurer of the district at the first meeting of the Board of Directors following the convention. The treasurer shall be a layperson.
 - h. The members of the Board of Directors elected by the convention "shall also have the authority to choose to appoint to the board up to three voting lay members from the district's congregations to obtain additional skill sets (legal, finance, investment, administration, etc.)" (Synod bylaw 4.5.1).
 - i. Elected members of the Board of Directors, other than the secretary, the president, and the first vice president, shall serve six (6) year terms. The term of appointive members of the Board of Directors shall expire at the installation of a newly elected Board of Directors.

Article III – THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS

B. ORGANIZATION

1. The secretary shall be the Secretary of the Board of Directors. The members of the Board of Directors elected at the convention shall elect the chairman, vice chairman, and such other officers of the board as deemed necessary at the first meeting of the district triennium. The

- chairman and vice chairman shall be elected from those members of the Board of Directors elected by the convention.
 - 2. The Board of Directors shall meet at least quarterly four (4) times a year and shall keep accurate minutes of its meetings.
 - 3. Special meetings may be called by the chairman or upon request of three board members. Those calling a special meeting shall set the date of such meeting. The office of the president shall notify each board member of such special meeting and its purpose.
 - 4. A majority of the voting members of the Board of Directors must be present at a properly called meeting to constitute a quorum.
 - 5. The chairman shall conduct the meetings and be responsible for the agenda of each meeting.
- 6. In the event of a vacancy on the Board of Directors, the remaining members of the board elected by the convention may elect a successor for the unexpired term.
 - 7. The Board of Directors shall establish, maintain, and follow policy and procedure manuals.
 - 8. Special committees may be appointed within the Board of Directors at its discretion according to Synod Bylaws 1.5.3.2 and 1.5.3.3.

Article III – THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS

- Except as otherwise expressly provided in these bylaws, the Board of Directors shall hold responsibility for the district between conventions. To this end it shall:
 - 1. At least annually review and when necessary revise the vision, mission, and strategies it has formulated in order to establish short, mid and long term goals through the president;
 - 2. Receive and act on the recommendations of the president, council, and committees assigned by the Board of Directors;
 - 3. Coordinate the district's work with Synod's; 4.5.1 (c)
 - 4. Submit proposed annual support goals to the;
 - 5. Establish an annual budget of the district on the basis of the share of the Lord's work assumed by the congregations;
 - 6. Balance the budget as nearly as possible and be authorized to do any and all such things as may be necessary or expedient to accomplish this end;
 - 7. Acquire, hold, lease, mortgage, pledge, sell, convey, or otherwise dispose of property, real or personal tangible or intangible, on in behalf of the Missouri District;
- 8. Provide for adequate support personnel as well as policies and procedures for the operation of the district office;
- 9. Determine and define the number, role, function, and responsibility of staff members;
 - 10. Report to the convention of the district;
 - 11. Approve the site of the district convention upon recommendation of the district president;

- 1 12. Engage a CPA firm to audit the financial records of the district at least annually or at any time during the year as it deems advisable;
- 3 13. Engage legal counsel to advise the district regarding legal matters;
- 4 14. Provide for the bonding of all officers handling district funds;
 - 15. Appoint an archivist;

16. Conduct, supervise, and manage all affairs of the district not otherwise assigned.

Article IV - DUTIES OF OFFICERS AND STAFF

All officers of the district, whether elected or appointed, shall discharge the duties assigned to them in the Synod Constitution and Bylaws and the district bylaws.

A. DUTIES OF THE PRESIDENT

- The president shall:
 - 1. Exercise ecclesiastical supervision over the doctrine, practice, life, and administration of all elected, called, and appointed officers and the Ministers of Religion Ordained, and Ministers of Religion Commissioned, and certified church workers, lay, of the district;
 - 2. Perform the duties set forth in Synod Bylaw 4.4 and Synod Constitution Article XII and especially serve as chief executive of the district who leads the Board of Directors in the formulation of the district's vision, mission and strategies and in their implementation;
 - 3. Be a member of the Board of Directors;
 - 4. Convene the circuit visitors at least annually;
 - 5. Be a non-voting ex-officio member of all committees including those for professional conferences except the Committee on Nominations;
 - 6. Designate one of the vice presidents as his representative to any commission or committee he may deem advisable;
 - 7. Make such appointments as are directed by the district through its bylaws or resolutions;
 - 8. Appoint all necessary committees and an assistant secretary for the convention;
 - 9. Be responsible that the resolutions of the Synod, and district and Board of Directors are implemented and coordinated;
 - 10. Make sure that the district personnel, staff, boards, task forces, and committees are working together in harmony to implement the mission, vision and strategies adopted by the convention and the Board of Directors;
 - 11. Be responsible for an up-to-date procedures manual, adequately indexed for recording procedures necessary for the effective and efficient operation of the convention and also for officers, board, council, committees, and district personnel;
 - 12. Have responsibility for supervising the staff according to their respective assignment of duties. He may appoint members of the staff to assist him;
 - 13. Ensure that the needs of district congregations (especially those enumerated in Article V.D) are addressed.

- 3 Council members shall:
- 1. Be elected by the convention with two (2) Ministers of Religion Ordained, two (2) Ministers of Religion Commissioned, and two (2) laypersons;
 - 2. As many as three additional council members may be recommended by the council chairman, approved by the president and appointed by the Board of Directors; the term of appointive members of the Council shall expire at the installation of a newly elected Council;
 - 3. Appointees to the council shall have a minimum of three years professional or volunteer experience appropriate to the council responsibilities;
 - 4. Include the president or his appointee.

13 Article VIII - ELECTION AND APPOINTMENT PROCEDURES

14 A. GENERAL PROVISIONS

- 1. The following shall be elected at each convention: The president, the vice presidents, the secretary, members of the Board of Directors, members of the Council on Mission and Ministry, the circuit visitors, and the Committee on Nominations.
 - 2. All appointive offices shall be filled after the convention.
 - 3. In making appointments, the Board of Directors and president shall give consideration to provide a cross-section of representation throughout the district.
 - 4. Each The district convention shall elect to a six-year term on the Board of Directors one (1) Minister of Religion Ordained, elected at large and one (1) Minister of Religion Commissioned, elected at large, and twothree (23) laypersons, elected at large (two of the three at-large laypersons shall be elected at one convention, and the other elected at the subsequent convention). At alternating district conventions laypersons shall be elected at large to six year terms, with 2 (two) being elected at one convention and (1) one being elected at the following convention.
 - 5. Each district convention shall elect to a six-year term on the Council on Mission and Ministry one (1) Minister of Religion Ordained, one (1) Minister of Religion Commissioned, and one (1) layperson.

Article VIII - ELECTION AND APPOINTMENT PROCEDURES

32 B. COMMITTEE ON NOMINATIONS

1. A Committee on Nominations consisting of four Ministers of Religion – Ordained, two Ministers of Religion – Commissioned, and four laypersons, representing all areas of the district is to be elected as a standing committee at each convention.

- 2. The members of the Committee on Nominations shall serve one term of three years and are eligible to serve again after at least three years have elapsed. A list of candidates for membership on this committee shall be submitted to the convention by the outgoing Committee on Nominations.
 - 3. The president shall convene and orientate the Nominating Committee at least eighteen (18) months prior to the convention. The president shall appoint the chairman from among the elected members of the Nominating Committee.
 - 4. Duties of Committee on Nominations:

- a. The Committee on Nominations shall circularize the Ministers of Religion Ordained and congregations of the district for names and qualifications of Ministers of Religion Ordained, Ministers of Religion Commissioned, and laypersons to serve as secretary, members of the Board of Directors, or members of the Council on Mission and Ministry.
 - 1. Ministers of Religion Ordained to serve as district secretary, members of the Council on Mission and Ministry, and at-large member of the Board of Directors.
 - 2. Ministers of Religion Commissioned to serve as at-large members of the Board of Directors and members of the Council on Mission and Ministry.
 - 3. Laypersons to serve as-members of the Board of Directors and the Council on Mission and Ministry.
- b. The committee itself shall, when sufficient recommendations are not submitted by the announced deadline, place eligible candidates on the ballot.
- c. In presenting a slate to the convention, the committee shall supply a brief biographical sketch of each candidate appearing on the ballot. All names shall be listed alphabetically on the official ballot.
- d. The committee shall endeavor to represent all the areas of the district in nominating at least two candidates for each elected office for which the committee is responsible for providing nominations or position with the exception of the president, the vice presidents, and the circuit visitors. The committee shall further endeavor to represent the needed skill sets for the Board of Directors (legal, finance, investment, administration) and the Council on Mission and Ministry. The convention reserves the right to place additional names on the ballot. No candidate shall be nominated by the nominating committee for more than one position with the exception of membership on the Committee on Nominations.
- e. Nominations for the district representative and alternate for the Synod's Committee for Convention Nomination shall be according to Synod Bylaw 3.12.3 ff.

Article VIII - ELECTION AND APPOINTMENT PROCEDURES

C. COMMITTEE ON ELECTIONS

- 1. A Committee on Elections consisting of four Ministers of Religion Ordained, two Ministers of Religion Commissioned, and four laypersons shall be appointed by the president.

VACANCIES D.

1. If the Office of President becomes vacant, the first vice president shall serve as president until the next presidential election. The new president may serve part-time, with the consent of the Board of Directors, until the next election.

- 2. If the president becomes incapacitated, his work shall be assumed temporarily by the first vice president. The decision as to when the president has become incapacitated and when he is no longer incapacitated shall be made by the Board of Directors.
- 3. A vacancy in any vice presidency shall be filled by advancing the lower-ranking vice presidents. The resulting vacancy may be filled by an appointment election of the Board of Directors. A slate of nominees shall be made by the praesidium from candidates for the vice presidency at the previous convention.
- 4. If the office of circuit visitor becomes vacant, the office shall be filled by presidential appointment.
- 5. Vacancies on board, council, and committees shall be filled in a manner as prescribed in the district bylaws governing board, council, and committee administration.
