Bold Hope in Christ

The Twenty-Second District Convention opened with Divine Service Sunday, June 22, 2025. Rev. Peter Lange, first vice president of The Lutheran Church–Missouri Synod (LCMS) served as preacher, building on the Convention's theme: *Bold Hope in Christ*.

Lange reminded delegates that our hope is not vague or uncertain—it is bold, confident, and grounded in the unshakable promises of Christ. Quoting 2 Cor. 3:12 (ESV), Lange said, "Since we have such a hope, we are very bold." In the face of hardship, cultural change, or personal suffering, the Church does not retreat. Instead, with boldness, we confess Christ, trust His Word, and proclaim the Gospel to the world. This hope, Lange emphasized, is not based on human strength but rooted in Christ's death and resurrection, and sustained by His Spirit for every moment and every mission.

The service was hosted by St. Paul's Lutheran Church in Concordia, Mo. Assisting in the service were Rev. Randy Asburry, Rev. Benjamin T. Ball, President Rev. Dr. Lee Hagan, Rev. Andrew Lehenbauer, Rev. William Marler, Rev. Craig Otto, Rev. Michael Pottschmidt, and Rev. Brian Thieme. Convention Offering

Our sincerest thanks to the many congregations that have prayed for the proceedings of this convention and held a door offering in connection with Sunday's worship service. This effort is an opportunity to invest in the work God has called us to do and to encourage one another as we serve with "Bold Hope in Christ."

The designation for the convention offering is the scholarship endowment for university and seminary students preparing for professional church work vocations—commonly known throughout the state as *Tomorrow's Teachers & Preachers*.

- While the endowment was created more than 40 years ago, an intentional effort through the *Tomorrow's Teachers & Preachers* campaign the last four years has grown the size of the investment by 10%, allowing for the healthy continuation of these scholarships.
- It is our goal to increase the endowment by an additional 10% over the upcoming triennium, providing more funds to more students.

Yesterday's offering at the opening worship service totaled \$15,077.52. Thank you to all who gave. May these gifts be used for God's glory! The apostle Paul encouraged those reading his letters that despite everything going on around them and the work that was before them, they could move with confidence knowing that God would sustain them. "Bold Hope in Christ" is an excellent reminder for us all in this present day as we serve congregations and schools throughout the state. The Missouri District is blessed to do this work in God's kingdom with you all.
